
cuti

director's statement

I Cut I is an adaptation of a blog entry from an old schoolmate of mine. It is autobiographical and thus, quite real. I tried to stay true to what she wrote, but also tried to convey a visually compelling story since there is no dialog or interaction with other characters.

While preparing the project, I researched self-harm and self-mutilation. Although I was aware that people do this regularly, I just didn't know that it was more common than I had first thought.







production notes

The cutting scenes had to feel real so I spent some time researching how to achieve effective looking shots with blood. I also wanted to experiment with the visuals during the cutting scene for a heightened sense of euphoria. For that, we used an Arri 16s, which is a regular 16mm film format camera with a variable motor. The grainy look along with the fluctuating speed helped us get images that would contrast against the smooth, digital feel of the rest of the film.
