
The Hitman and the Cleaner

Synopsis

Two professional assassins, the Hitman and the Cleaner, are scheduled to rendezvous before their next job. Cleaner arrives on time, but Hitman arrives late which seems to be the norm. When Hitman finally arrives, Cleaner lectures to Hitman that tardiness can hinder their ability to do their job effectively. They argue back and forth, recalling jobs of old and achieve nothing but more animosity towards one another. Once Hitman has had just about enough from Cleaner, he gets up to leave, all the while, tossing a box of donuts and a coffee cup on the ground, telling Cleaner to clean it up. As Hitman gets to his car, Cleaner zaps him with a stun gun, and offs Hitman.



Director's Statement

I'm a huge fan of movies that involve the underworld, spies, espionage, or anything that has to do with a secret society - fictionalized people that could actually exist in real world. What I envisioned for The Hitman and the Cleaner was a story that reflected a typical 9 to 5 office environment, but for professional assassins. In this fictional world of assassins, everyone has a specific job, just as they do in the typical modern day office environment.

Production Notes

I wanted to raise the production value in The Hitman and the Cleaner from my previous short film. Overall, it was an ambitious project for me, considering this is only my second film. It has seven characters, five locations, and three picture vehicles. For a short film that can be

a lot. Scheduling to make all these elements fit was a humongous task considering the very short shooting period. Production was a very tight three days. We only went over 12 hours once. Additionally, due to budget constraints, I could not afford any pickup days. Needless to say, my producer, Elias Jimenez, and I spent a long time prepping to make sure every minute and cent counted.

Choosing the right camera for this project was also a very important aspect for making The Hitman and the Cleaner. I wanted to experiment with camera movement and achieving a variety of looks for each location. Our DP, Pietro Villani, suggested that we go with the Arri Alexa for its high dynamic range and track record for great results. We also relied heavily on a Chapman Peewee dolly to get moving shots in tight places.

Brahm Gallagher - Cleaner

Brahm is an awarded member of The Conservatory Company at The American Academy of Dramatic Arts, Hollywood and is a US Army veteran. His intense character portrayals are offset by the confidence and humility he brings to his roles. Brahm is an avid, independent film actor



and proud to work with true auteurs. Brahm has been praised by his colleagues and always continues searching for the next challenge, the next film, the next evolution.

Several of Brahm's films have screened at festivals worldwide, including Cannes and Newport Beach over consecutive years. Compulsion, in which Brahm starred, received an Honorable Mention award at the 2011 Los Angeles New Wave International Film Festival. Currently, Brahm has three films in varied stages of post production, with The Devout set to hit the festival circuit this fall and the 1920's gangland shoot 'em up, Shoot the Sax Player, eyeing a winter release. He is represented by 90210 Talent and Serendipity Entertainment.



Nicholas Richardson - Hitman

When Olivia was a little girl, she held on tight to her daddy's rock and roll records. Dino Dumandan - Writer/Director/Exec. Producer


